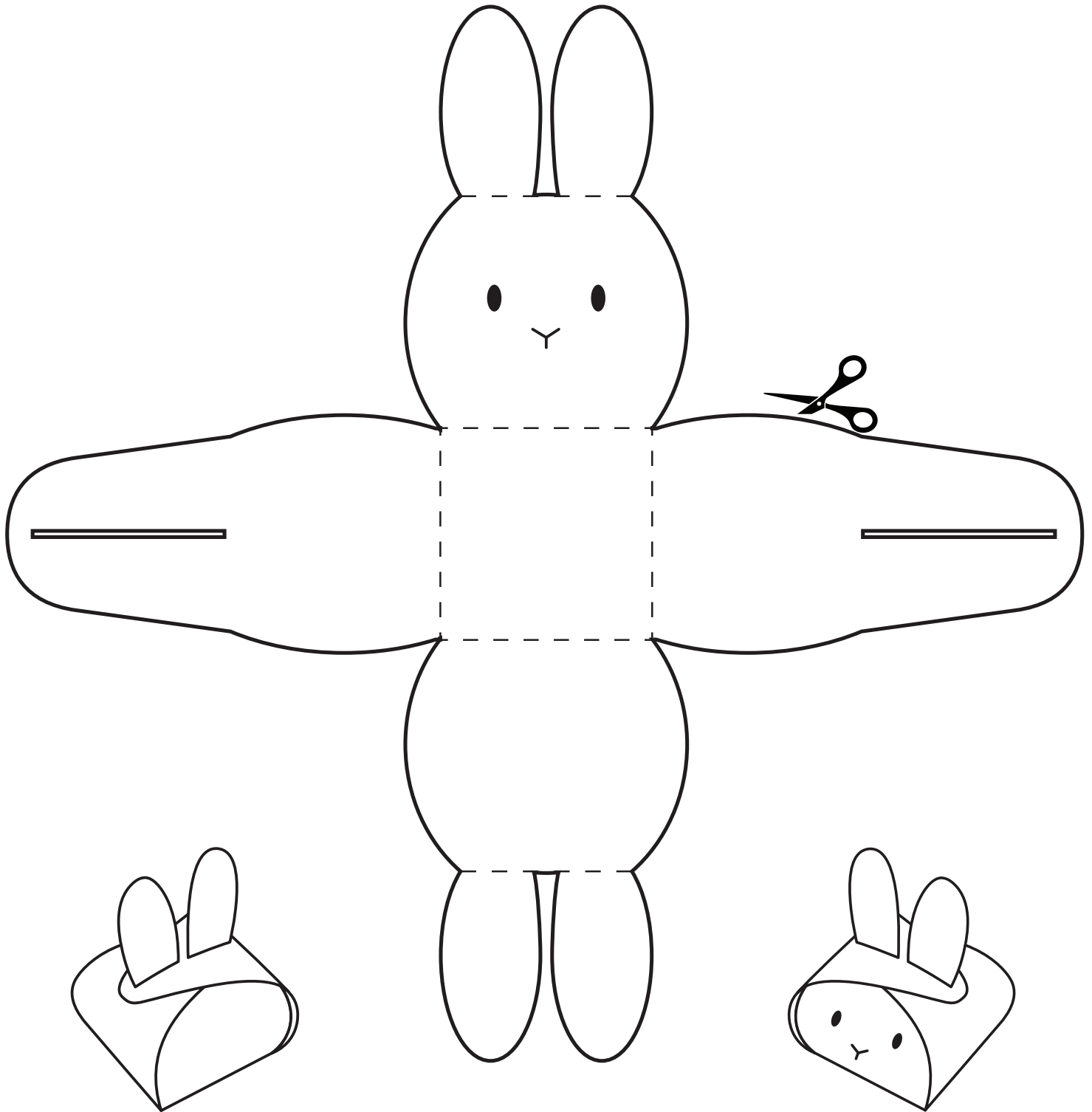

Easter Egg Bunny Basket

Ages 7+ (Adult supervision recommended)

For this fun Easter activity, you will need:

- Coloured Paper / Plain Paper
- Scissors (use scissors under adult supervision)
- Decorations for your basket

Step 1: To start off, cut out the template, ensuring you cut out the little slots on the side flaps for the ears to go into! (If you need a hand with this, ask a parent or guardian.)

Step 2: Once you have cut out your template, it should look like image 1. At this stage, if you want to decorate your basket before it is assembled, now is the time! You can colour your bunny, give them whiskers or even put paint and other crafting materials onto them.

Step 3: Make sure to then fold along all of the dotted lines so that you can start to put your basket together.

Step 4: When you have folded them, pinch the bunny ears together and push down lightly to form the basis of the bunny basket. (Image 2).

Step 5: Next, bring one of the flaps over the bunny's head and slip the ears through the little slits you cut out earlier (Image 3).

Step 6: Do the same on the other side so that your bunny basket is held tightly together (Image 4).

Step 7: Now you have your finished bunny Easter basket! You can make as many of these as you need to give out to party guests or place onto your dinner table as party favours.
